SIMUC thanks Wake Forest University Department of Music for their kind collaboration, making their magnificent theater available, and this concert in Winston-Salem a reality.

About The Performer

Chilean classical guitarist **Sebastián Molina** has performed as a soloist and chamber musician throughout the United States, Europe, and Latin America. He was selected to perform at the "I Played a Concert at GFA" at the 50th anniversary of the Guitar Foundation of America festival and convention, in a special non-competitive category. He was recently invited to perform in The Village Trip GuitarFest 2023 in Greenwich Village, New York, where he gave the world premiere of the work "Volver a los 19" by Chilean composer Felipe Pinto D'Aguiar, a work commissioned by the Guitarra Viva Foundation.

His Duo Encuentro de Dos Mundos, along with mezzo-soprano Belem Abraham, has performed in numerous concerts and music festivals including "Fred Schneiter" in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil; "Encuentro Guitarrístico de Choroní" in Venezuela; Latinoamérica de Concierto" in Colombia, "Sonamos Latinoamérica" in Mexico; and Festival Entrecuerdas in Chile.

Sebastián Molina performs as a member of the Brooklyn Guitar Society of New York, a guitar circle where he regularly premiers new music. Due to his interest in promoting music of contemporary Chilean composers, he is involved in developing projects to premiere new works. Recently, the International Society for Chilean Music (SIMUC) has selected the piece titled "Tres Microludios," composed by young Chilean composer Felipe González through their Call for Scores. The world premiere of this piece will take place in tonight's concert at Wake Forest University.

Sebastián has independently published two albums. The first recording "Recital al Sur" (2011) includes works for solo Chilean guitar, and his second album titled "El lado Violeta de una Conquista" (2013) was recorded along with mezzo-soprano Belem Abraham featuring songs of Spanish and Chilean music from the 19th and 20th centuries.

He has performed in master classes for the legendary guitarists Manuel Barrueco, Sergio Assad and Rafaela Smith. He has also attended classes from guitarists specializing in modern music such as Cristiano Porqueddu and Laura Snowden, and he has also participated in the 19th New York Guitar Seminar at the Mannes School of Music.

Sebastián holds a Bachelor's degree in music performance from Universidad Mayor in the studio of Professor José Antonio Escobar in Chile, and a degree in music education from the Pontifical Catholic University of Chile. He also studied with Dr. Nicolás Emilfork between 2019 and 2021 in Chile. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in music performance at the Manhattan School of Music in New York, under the guidance of renowned guitarist David Leisner. Sebastián has been awarded scholarships from the Guitarra Viva Foundation, the Chile Crea Scholarship program, Chilean Society of Copyright (SCD), and is also the recipient of a merit scholarship awarded by the Manhattan School of Music. In addition to his studies, he also serves on the music faculty of Holy Child Catholic Academy and Our Savior Catholic Church in New York. 
